ABVE Certification



Dear Applicant:

Thank you for your inquiry regarding the American Board of Vocational Experts (ABVE). ABVE has set forth the following formalized standard for identifying persons for board certification as Vocational Experts. The person must:

- A. Be a current ABVE Associate Member
- B. Have specific training and experience in areas such as assessment, vocational rehabilitation and evaluation, psychological testing and measurement, job analysis, job placement, labor market surveys, and job site analysis; the Applicant must have experience providing testimony in at least one of these areas.

Social Security Vocational Expert (SSVE) testimony is not considered an acceptable forensic work product.

- C. Knowledge and expertise must be clearly demonstrated within a submitted forensic work product (work product must include generally accepted methodology and forensic analysis within the field of vocational rehabilitation and evaluation); and,
- D. Provide transcripts showing attainment of a Masters or Doctoral degree: Proof of transcripts/equivalent coursework and sample work experience are required. Any discipline that deviates from the list below will be reviewed by the Peer Review Committee to determine if it meets ABVE's standards...
 - Masters/Doctorate in School Psychology
 - Masters/Doctorate in Psychology (MA, MS, M.Ed.)
 - Masters/Doctorate in Rehabilitation
 - Masters/Doctorate in Therapy/ Counseling
 - Masters/Doctorate in Vocational/Counseling Vocational/Rehabilitation
- E. A minimum of three Letters of Reference documenting your years of experience providing expert opinion in a forensic setting (ie. Attorneys, Judges, Hearing Officers, Arbitrators, etc.)
- F. Demonstrate minimum competency by attaining a passing score on the ABVE examination; and,
- G. Adhere to the ABVE Code of Ethics.

CERTIFICATION LEVELS

FELLOW status requires a minimum of three years of documented experience as a **Vocational Expert in** in a **forensic setting**, in addition to the requirements listed above.

DIPLOMATE status requires at least seven years of documented experience as a Vocational Expert in a forensic setting. The Diplomate status is reserved for those professionals who exemplify distinguished performance or recognition as a vocational expert, in addition to the above requirements. This may include but is not limited to the following: published works in a peer reviewed journal with subject matter pertinent to forensic vocational issues; leadership position in a professional organization in the field; presentation of papers at professional conferences in the realm of vocational expert testimony and assessment; and/or sitting on study groups or legislative committees to advance the practice of forensics and vocational expert testimony.

ETHICAL STANDARDS

The American Board of Vocational Experts recognizes and supports policies and professional standards of the various rehabilitation credentialing bodies. This scope is all encompassing, but focused on the integrity and industry demand for ethical policies and practices. ABVE maintains strict guidelines on ethical concerns/complaints and executes rapid action with all ABVE members (Associate, Fellow, and Diplomate) who are found to have violated one or more of these ethical canons. It is with this philosophy that professionals who have been sanctioned by any vocational rehabilitation credentialing body with loss of membership will not be allowed to take the ABVE examination or hold the ABVE credential.

To be considered for Fellow/Diplomate certification, <u>you must meet the above criteria</u> and submit your application with the required documents. The application fee of \$225 is non-refundable. References should be individuals who can attest to the applicant's knowledge in forensics work, these references must be attorneys, judges, insurance companies or other referral sources who have utilized the candidate in a forensic setting. Supervisors or coworkers do not meet this criteria.

Fees Required at Time of Application:

- \$225 A one time non-refundable application fee
 \$195 Associate ABVE Membership fee (if not a current ABVE Member) Once criterion are met, the following fee will apply for certification to be valid:
- \$80 ABVE/F or ABVE/D Credential Fee

Fees for Maintaining ABVE Fellow/Diplomate Once Certification is Valid:

- \$195 ABVE Associate Membership fee will be due January 1st of each year
- \$80 -Credential Fee for ABVE/F or ABVE/D will be due January 1st of each year.

Fee Policy Should the Candidate not fulfill all requirements:

Should an applicant submit a completed application packet for credentialing and the Peer Review process finds the applicant short in experience or coursework, the applicant will have one (1) year from the date of application to fulfill all requirements. Once the year has lapsed, if the requirements have not been met, the applicant must submit a new application packet and fee.

Other Maintenance Requirements:

Continuing Education Units (CEU) credits will be required to maintain your certification.
 The certification cycle is a 3-year cycle, the period will begin January 1, 2019 and end
 December 31, 2021. You must submit 42 credit hours to ABVE by the end of each 3-year cycle to maintain your certification.

When ABVE receives your completed application, it will be reviewed by the Peer Review Committee. If you pass peer review, you will be invited to sit for the exam. On completion of the exam, you will be notified of the Committee's recommendation.
